Enhancing Service Delivery Through Digital Innovation: IMIS Training in Focus



On 03-04 March 2026, the Municipality advanced its Integrated Municipal Information System (IMIS) Customer Care Module Training which is an initiative aimed at strengthening operational efficiency and elevating service standards.

Facilitated by Total Geo-Spatial Information Solutions, the two-day program brought together officials from the Revenue and Debt Collection Unit and the Infrastructure Department.

The training forms part of a broader strategy to equip municipal teams with the tools and capabilities required to manage customer interactions with greater precision and accountability. The responsive service delivery is increasingly shaped by technology, the Ga-Segonyana Local Municipality is taking deliberate steps to modernize its customer engagement systems.

Mining Houses empowering Service Delivery

In a shared commitment to building resilient communities where access to water is not a privilege but a sustained reality. The Ga-Segonyana Local Municipality extends its gratitude to Assmang Iron Ore Khumani Mine and South 32 Mine for their contributions to Ga-Segonyana Water Network System.

Assmang Iron Ore Khumani mine has officially handed over Eighteen (18) refurbished water boreholes across Ga-Segonyana which were previously non-functioning. South 32 Mine has electrified Three (3) water pump stations in Seeding Village which were handed over to the Municipality during the end of the last Quarter. On 19 March 2026, an oversight inspection was done.

Vandalism and theft of municipal properties highly experienced at boreholes and pump stations across Ga-Segonyana continue to hinder the progress made in improving the Municipal Water Supply System.
